2000 also saw the first of the rallies that ultimately became the ‘Flamborough legend’ at Hartendale Farm. This venue alternated with the neighbouring Beacon Farm until 2005, usually because of the Caravan Club jumping in and making an early booking!

2005/06/07/08 saw Peter and Susan have a ‘purple patch’ as they ran the Flamborough rallies twice a year. In 2009 they then settled down to run Hartendale Farm every year until 2019. In all, a grand total of 24 rallies! This venue became a regular ‘follow on’ to the AGM, even when it was held in other parts of the country many miles away.

Peter and Susan became so associated with this rally that they even had the rally field named after them – ‘Conway Field’ – the only rally marshals anywhere and in any owners club that I am aware of, to have this honour bestowed on them.

So to 2019 – our intrepid couple, now some years older, had decided that this would be the last Flamborough rally that they would run, before handing over the reins to David and Diane and a small presentation was made to mark this event.

Peter was always his own man, Yorkshire through and through, with his own inimitable style, but we loved him this way and would not have

changed him for the world. His quizzes will be long remembered not only for his unique style of delivery, but also their fun and hilarity. He also liked to give ralliers maximum value for their rally and social fees as witnessed by the afternoon teas and the huge selection of items in their buffet salads – up to 32 in one case!
